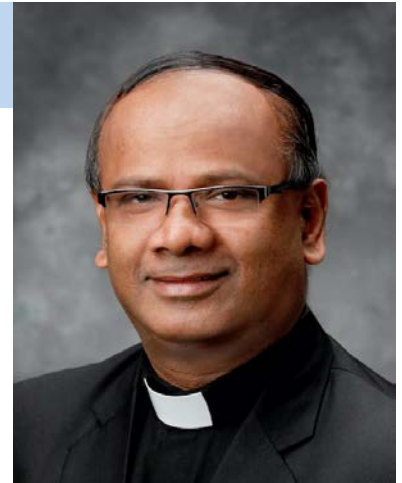

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST. MARTIN OF TOURS, BISHOP

NOV 11TH



St. Martin of Tours was born in 316, Sabaria, Pannonia, now Szombathely, Hungary. Martin's parents were pagans, but at the **age of 10, Martin chose to respond to the call** of the Gospel and become a Christian. Legend holds that Martin cut his cloak in half to share it with a beggar. That night, **he dreamed that Jesus himself was clothed with the torn cloak**. When he awoke, the garment was restored. Moved by this vision and apparent miracle, Martin immediately finished his religious instruction and was baptized at age 18.

St. Martin of Tours was chosen by the consent of the people as the **Bishop of Tours** in 371. Though he initially opposed it and tried to hide, he was tricked and led to the cathedral where his ordination awaited. Once ordained the Bishop of Tours, Bishop Martin moved outside the city and **established hermitages** with other clerics where he led a life of prayer.

St. Martin of Tours traveled throughout Gaul, France, preaching, converting, performing miracles, and casting out demons. His language was always respectful, he treated others with exceptional kindness, he often **gave most of his money and belongings to the poor**.

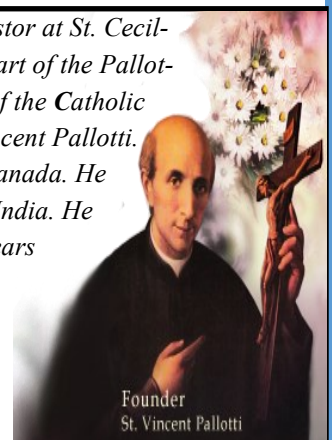
St. Martin of Tours died November 8, 397, Candes, Gaul, France. **Patron Saint of France**, Pontifical Swiss Guards, beggars, innkeepers etc. He is also **the father of monasticism in Gaul**, and the first great leader of Western monasticism.

Saying of the saint

"Lord, if your people need me, I will not refuse the work. **Your will be done.**" **St. Martin of Tours.**

Fr. Paul Raj, SAC has been the pastor at St. Cecilia's since November 2014 and is part of the Pallottine Fathers Community (Society of the Catholic Apostolate) who's patron is St. Vincent Pallotti. St. Cecilia's is his first parish in Canada. He comes from the Tamil province of India. He was also in the Philippines for 3 years serving and studying.
