



## SAINT OF THE WEEK

## ST. MARTIN DE PORRES, RELIGIOUS NOV 3<sup>RD</sup>



St. Martin de Porres, the first black saint of the Americas, was born in Lima, Peru on Dec 9<sup>th</sup>, 1579. He began his life in poverty and rejection as his father abandoned him, his mother, and his younger sister. After spending just two years in primary school, Martin was placed with a barber/surgeon where he would learn to cut hair and the medical arts.

St. Martin de Porres was very eager to serve and began to volunteer with the Dominicans at age 15 and helped care for the sick in the monastery infirmary and also worked in the kitchen and doing laundry. He had great compassion for all people, regardless of their race or status, and his loving care extended to animals, including stray cats and dogs, beasts of the field, and even kitchen vermin.

St. Martin de Porres was known for his devotion to the Eucharist and constant prayer. It is said that he had many extraordinary abilities, including aerial flights, bilocation, instant cures, miraculous knowledge, and spiritual knowledge. He was great friends with both St. Juan Macías, a fellow Dominican lay brother, and St. Rose of Lima, a lay Dominican. He died on Nov. 3, 1639, at age 60.

Patron Saint of African Americans, barbers, innkeepers, the poor, Peru, public health workers, and social justice.




