

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST. CATHERINE OF ALEXANDRIA. VIRGIN AND MARTYRS

NOV 25TH



St. Vincent Pallotti

St. Catherine was born around 287 in Alexandria, Egypt. At that time, Alexandria was one of the finest cities in the world, and a center of learning and culture as well as faith. When she was fourteen years old, she experienced a moving vision of Mary and the infant Jesus that moved her to become a Christian.

When St. Catherine heard that the Roman emperor Maxentius was persecuting Christians, she publicly protested. Stunned by her bravery, Maxentius sent fifty famous philosophers to try to change her mind, but Catherine, with her clever arguments, converted every one of them to Christianity. The emperor then tried to persuade Catherine to become his bride. Catherine refused, saying that she was already a bride of Christ.

Maxentius became furious and commanded that St. Catherine be tortured on the infamous spiked wheel, later it was called the "Catherine wheel". But the wheel broke, and the spikes flew off, injuring onlookers but leaving Catherine unharmed. She was eventually beheaded around

305, and angels carried body up to Mount Sinai.
