FR. PAUL'S COLUMN

ST. STANISLAUS, BISHOP, AND MARTYR

APR 11TH 2024 1030 - 1079

St. Stanislaus, the Polish bishop, and martyr was born near Krakow in Poland. His parents were wealthy as well as devout

and charitable. They did not have a child for many years and when his mother conceived Stanislaus later in their lives, his parents saw their child as a gift from Heaven.

St. Stanislaus from his youth was very devout, charitable toward the poor, fervent in mortifications, and grow in virtues. St. Stanislaus spent seven years in parish studying canon law and theology. After his parents died, he received a huge inheritance, which he gave to the poor.

St. Stanislaus was ordained to the priesthood by the Bishop of Krakow. When the Bishop of Krakow died, St. Stanislaus was chosen as his successor by popular acclaim. He refused to accept it but on the explicit order from Pope he accepted and was ordained a bishop around the age of forty-two.

When Bolesław II was King of Poland, it was said that Bishop Stanislaus had purchased land for the church from a man named Piotr. After the death of Piotr, his three sons disputed the sale and complained to the king. The King sided with them and ordered the return of the property. St. Stanislaus asked for three days to produce Piotr as his witness. All laughed and the king gave him three days. After three days of fasting and prayer, Bishop Stan-

islaus went to the cemetery in proces- Fr. Paul Raj, SAC has been the pastor at St. Cecilsion and dug the grave and ordered **him to rise**. He rose and testified to the king that he sold the property and scolded his sons before returning to his grave.

Patron Saint of Poland, soldiers in battle, moral order and was canonized by Pope Innocent IV on September 17, 1253, in Assisi, Italy.

As we celebrate the Easter Octave as One Great Week, we invite you to attend our weekday Masses, Tuesday to Saturday at 9am

This weekend, we observe <u>Divine Mercy Sunday</u>. Following each Mass the Divine Mercy chaplet will be prayed, with the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, concluding with Benediction.

What is Divine Mercy Sunday?

In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Today, we know that feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000. The Lord expressed His will with regard to this feast in His very first revelation to St. Faustina. The most comprehensive revelation can be found in her *Diary* entry 699:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity... The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter.

Divine Mercy Sunday is NOT a feast based solely on St. Faustina's revelations. Indeed, it is not primarily about St. Faustina — nor is it altogether a new feast. The Second Sunday of Easter was already a solemnity as the Octave Day of Easter 11. The title "Divine Mercy Sunday" does, however, highlight the meaning of the day.
