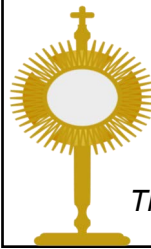

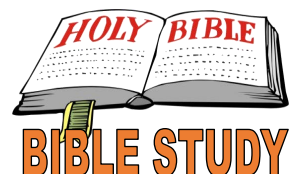
Prayer Shawl Ministry: last Tuesday of the month after the 9am Mass. New knitters welcome. Yarn is available.

Acts of the Apostles | Every Tuesday after the 9am Mass in the boardroom.

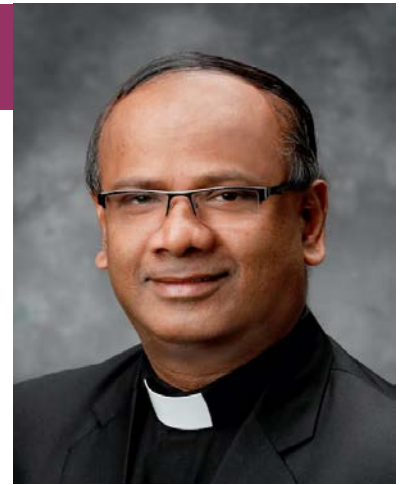

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST. JOSEPH OF ARIMATHEA

MARCH 17TH



St Joseph of Arimathea early years little is known except that he was the son of wealthy of a noble parent who were very pious lived in Arimathea, a city of the Jews. He was taught sacred scriptures and knew the coming of the Savior and Redeemer as foretold by the Holy Prophets.

St. Josph of Arimathea was a counselor and had the position of an honorable and respected member of the Sanhedrin, the Jewish Council in Jerusalem. He was a good man, just, virtuous and righteous and was himself awaiting the kingdom of God.

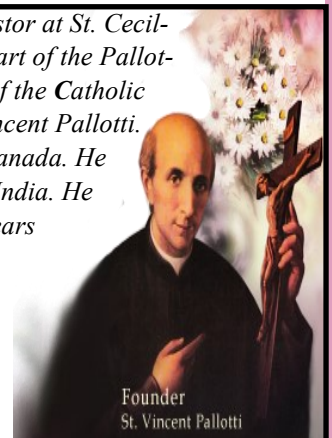
St. Josph of Arimathea was a disciple of Jesus, but he did not declare himself as such for fear of the Jews. On account of this secret allegiance to Jesus, he did not consent to His condemnation by the Sanhedrin, and was most likely absent from the meeting which sentenced Jesus to death.

St. Josph of Arimathea went boldly unto Pilate and begged from him the body of Jesus. He along with **St. Nicodemus**, removed Christ's body from the Cross, prepared it for burial, and placed it in his own sepulcher. When the Jewish spies found out about this told their authorities and they imprisoned him. Sometime later the Jews released St. Joseph from prison and banished him from Jerusalem. He then traveled throughout the whole world preaching the Gospel, eventually sowing the seeds of salvation in Britain, where he reposed peacefully in the Lord.

St. Josph of Arimathea is the Patron saint of funeral directors.

Fr. Paul Raj, SAC has been the pastor at St. Cecilia's since November 2014 and is part of the Pallottine Fathers Community (Society of the Catholic Apostolate) whose patron is St. Vincent Pallotti. St. Cecilia's is his first parish in Canada. He comes from the Tamil province of India. He was also in the Philippines for 3 years serving and studying.

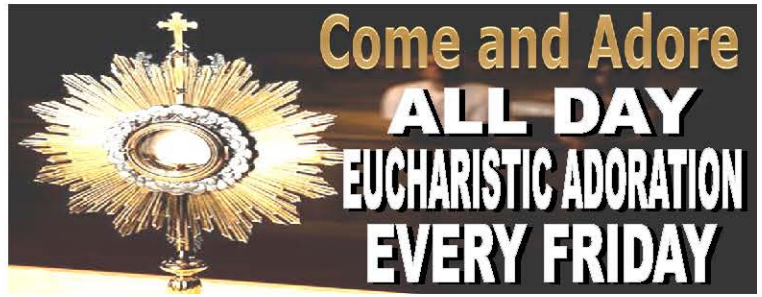

Dr. Elizabeth Klein and Taylor Kemp discuss the historical life of St. Patrick. Captured multiple times by pirates, St. Patrick escaped slavery and returned to his land of captivity to preach the Gospel to a pagan people. Living during a time of great plagues, St. Patrick preached the good news of a God who embraces suffering. His feast day is March 17.



While the Gospel has not preserved any of his words, his actions have resounded through the ages. Joseph of Nazareth stands out as the model par excellence of Christian virtue, a brilliant example of obedience to God and trust in Divine Providence. His role as protector of families in the difficulties of life and Patron of the universal Church has never been more clearly needed.

Bishops raise serious concerns about threats to charitable status designation

On Monday, 10 March 2025, the members of the Permanent Council of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCCB) expressed their grave concern regarding two recommendations made by the House of Commons Standing Committee on Finance within [Report 21: Pre-Budget Consultations in Advance of the 2025 Budget](#). These recommendations (#429 and #430), if adopted, would be profoundly detrimental to Canada's charitable sector, because they would:

- Revoke the charitable status of "anti-abortion organizations" (#429);
- Amend the *Income Tax Act* such that "the advancement of religion" would no longer qualify as a legitimate purpose for granting charitable status. (#430)

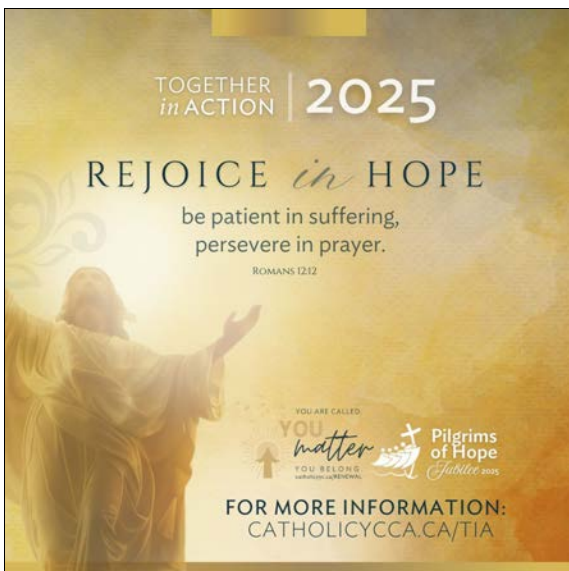
After consulting widely, including with experts in charity law, the members of the Permanent Council sent a letter to the Hon. Dominic LeBlanc, Minister of Finance, defending the value and role of faith-based charities for Canadian society, as well as the unfairness of targeting pro-life organizations. They urged the government to abandon the two recommendations and to conduct comprehensive consultations within the charitable sector before embarking on any legislative changes that could threaten the viability of charitable organizations and adversely affect the millions of Canadians who depend on them for essential services and support.
