



A Day of Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence from meat. The law of fasting binds all Catholics aged 18-59. Fasting means eating one full meal and two other meals that together do not equal a full meal. The law of abstinence from meat binds all Catholics aged 14 and older.

Fridays during Lent (and the Rest of the Year)

Fridays throughout the year - not just during Lent - are obligatory days of abstinence from meat, except when a Solemnity falls on a Friday. The Canadian Conference of Bishops has decreed that one may substitute abstaining from meat with another act of piety or charity.

Stations of the Cross

Every Friday during Lent @ 7 pm.

Confessions will be heard before the Stations from 6-6:45 pm and after the Stations.

Pastor's Message

This Wednesday, we enter the holy season of Lent. At Mass, ashes will be placed on our foreheads as a reminder of our mortality and a sign of our resolution to do penance for our sins.

Through the observance of Lent, which Pope Benedict XIV called the “badge of the Christian warfare,” we enter more deeply into the mystery of Christ’s suffering and are thereby prepared to share in His glory.

Fasting

One of the principal practices of Lent is fasting. Traditionally, Christians would fast throughout Lent by eating only one full meal a day except on Sundays. Although this practice is no longer obligatory, it’s good to do a little more penance than just fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and abstain from meat on Fridays. St. Thomas Aquinas mentions three benefits of fasting: 1) it curbs the lusts of the flesh; 2) it raises our minds to heavenly things; 3) it atones for sin. Christ tells us that fasting helps expel demons (Mark 9:29).

If you’re not used to fasting very much, don’t start eating only one meal a day. Instead, begin with something easier, like not snacking between meals. Then, once you’ve gotten used to that, you can start working your way up to more rigorous forms of fasting, according to your health and strength.

The two other practices of Lent are prayer and almsgiving. Almsgiving refers to all the works of mercy. There are seven works of mercy pertaining to the body and seven pertaining to the soul.

Corporal Works of Mercy

1. To feed the hungry.
2. To give drink to the thirsty.
3. To clothe the naked.
4. To shelter the homeless.
5. To visit the sick.
6. To visit the imprisoned.
7. To bury the dead.

Spiritual Works of Mercy

1. To admonish sinners.
2. To comfort the sorrowful.
3. To counsel the doubtful.
4. To instruct the ignorant.
5. To forgive offenses.
6. To bear wrongs patiently.
7. To pray for the living and the dead.

The observance of Lent is vital not only for our own growth in holiness but also for the good of the whole Church and of society. A holy Lent to all of you!
